## Employment Watch

Unemployed? Underemployed? Just looking for some extra cash? If so, you just might be in luck, because major retailers **locally** have already begun hiring temporary employees for the 2012 holiday season.

An added bonus to being a temporary hire is that your temporary job could become a permanent one. Simply Hired, a job search engine company, has advised employers to consider retaining top-performing seasonal

employees.

Last year, Toys R Us retained about 15 percent of their holiday hires after the season ended. This year, the company says “high-performing” employees may again be able to turn their temporary job into a permanent one, thanks to “substantial growth opportunities available.”

But don't delay. Simply Hired also suggested that employers start hiring early so they're stocked up on employees when holiday sales

ramp up. So the sooner you start applying, the better your odds. Local employers hiring right now include:

**Kohl's:** Positions to fill: More than 52,700 plus about 1,500 “regular” employees at 12 new stores across 10 states. How to apply: Online.

**Toys R Us:** Positions to fill: 45,000 . How to apply: Online

**Walmart:** Positions to fill: More than 50,000. How to apply: Online.

Right now in Butte County there are more than 1,900 individuals experiencing homelessness and of that 30 percent are living outdoors. With the cold winter months approaching, the Shalom Free Clinic wants to blanket Chico. November is National Homelessness Awareness month and in honor of that, the Shalom Free Clinic would like to provide the warmth of a new or gently used sleeping bag or blanket to individuals living without shelter. The Shalom Clinic is

asking for donations of blankets and sleeping bags that will be given out to homeless individuals in Chico. You can drop off your donations at the Shalom Free Clinic Thrift store. Vouchers for the sleeping bags and blankets will be distributed at the Jesus Center and other locations frequented by the local homeless population and can be **redeemed** at the Shalom Free Clinic Thrift Store, Monday-Saturday, 11:00 am to 5:00 pm. **Coming Soon!** The Shalom clinic will be

offering free dental care! The Shalom Clinic has received generous donations from local dentists and equipment from Project S.A.V.E. However they do need a few more pieces of equipment for the Dental Clinic to be operational. If you are able to help the clinics with dental supplies or monetary donations, the Clinic will be able to open the dental clinic and continue their mission on treating all aspects of health.
