Job Search Tip: Create a Professional Email



Creating a professional -looking email is an important feature on your resume. Here are some tips on what to avoid and how to create a professional email.

Using your name is your safest bet

An email such as jane.doe@email.com is more professional than hottie.jane@email.com or iloveapples@email.com; unless your email address is directly related to your business or organization.

Pick an email address that you can stick with

Select one domain, and use the sorting/filtering feature to managed your emails versus having multiple accounts.

Avoid references to race, creed, gender, religion, health status, or anything wild in your email address An email address such as ilovebuddha@email.com may offend individuals who do not have the same religious beliefs as you do. Select a neutral email address.

Avoid very long or typo-prone emails

Avoid using numbers in your email address when possible, or make a distinction between ambiguous characters. For example, employers might not know if jane00@email.com contains two zeros or two o's.

Keep your email address simple

If your name is long and/or often misspelled, only include the first few letters of your name. For example, jonathan.applegate@email.com may be shortened to j.Applegate@email.com to create a more simple, straight-forward email address.
